



## UNDERGRADUATE HONOR SYSTEM APPLICATION- HONOR COUNCIL DELEGATE

### Purpose:

Live out Ut Prosim through involvement with the Undergraduate Honor System. The Undergraduate Honor System is a student led system, designed to cultivate a culture of honor and integrity on campus. Becoming involved with the Undergraduate Honor System allows students to develop and utilize elite and social leadership skills such as time management, conflict management and public speaking. Students also serve as chairpersons of meetings and interact with administrators and faculty. These skills are highly sought-after by potential and future employers.

Honor Council Delegates are student leaders within the Undergraduate Honor System. Delegates conduct weekly administrative meetings in which they meet with students who have been reported to the honor system. Honor Council Delegates lead educational programs, assist in the training of Honor System personnel and discuss the honor system process with students and faculty. Honor Council Delegates represent an elite group of students who hold great responsibility in upholding the academic integrity of the institution. By becoming a part of this elite group of dedicated students, you will be making a huge difference in the campus community and preserving the value of the VT degree.

### Eligibility:

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Maintain an overall GPA of 2.0 or higher from the date of application through the 2017-18 academic year.
- 2) Must be in good academic and disciplinary standing.
- 3) Must be willing to commit to working two hours a week administratively in the Office.
- 4) Have weekly availability to meet with Office personnel, as well as hold administrative student meetings.
- 5) Be willing to participate in several outreach and programming events per semester.

By submitting the following information, you will be considered for the position of Honor Council Delegate within the Office of Undergraduate Academic Integrity.
